M.V.C.O 21.70 Drinking in Public Prohibited \$50.00

M.V.C.O 27.13 Unlawful to Obstruct a Sidewalk \$250.00

M.V.C.O 21.32 Sleeping on Park Benches \$50.00

M.V.C.O 38.15(a) Loitering in Parks After Hours \$75.00

M.V.C.O 38.15(b) Entering or Remaining at Park when Closed to the Public \$75.00

M.V.C.O 38.15(c) Vehicle in Park After Hours \$100.00

M.V.C.O 38.15 (l) Marking, Defacing, any City Property \$1,000

M.V.C.O 38.17(a): Possess or consume alcohol in certain parks or parking lot \$100.00
