

Advisory: RePlanet CRV Redemption Centers Closure – Impacts on Mountain View Recycling Center

RePlanet, the state’s largest independent recycling redemption operator, recently closed all sites in California, including two recycling centers near Nob Hill and Costco in Mountain View. CalRecycle will be replacing this operator.

What does this mean for residents? Demand for redemption of bottles and cans for cash has increased significantly at the Mountain View Recycling Center located at 935 Terra Bella Avenue. For the next few months you can expect lines, delays, and possibly being offered checks instead of cash for redemptions over \$50 (and possible early closure if redemption funds are exhausted for the day). To speed up lines, the center will pay by weight instead of individual count. Redemption lines will close 15 minutes before closing time to serve waiting customers in line. (Residents can drop-off other recyclables at the center without having to stand in line.) Another option for customers wanting to redeem bottles and cans is to visit our SMaRT Station located at 301 Carl Road, Sunnyvale. The SMaRT Station is owned by the cities of Mountain View, Palo Alto and Sunnyvale. For other locations, visit calrecycle.ca.gov.
