



NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING

CERTIFYING THE MOUNTAIN VIEW PUBLIC SAFETY BUILDING ENVIRONMENTAL IMPACT REPORT

The Mountain View City Council will hold a public hearing to consider the following: **Certifying the Mountain View Public Safety Building Environmental Impact Report and the following related matters in compliance with the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA):**

- **Adoption of Findings Related To Environmental Impacts, including the following:** *Less than Significant Impacts:* As indicated in the EIR, the project would result in significant impacts that can be avoided or reduced to a less-than-significant level through implementation of mitigation measures recommended in the EIR. **Significant and Unavoidable Impacts:** As indicated in the EIR, the project would result in one significant and unavoidable impact that cannot be avoided or reduced to a less-than-significant level through implementation of mitigation measures recommended in the EIR. **Impacts: Cultural and Tribal Cultural Resources - Impact CUL-1:** The proposed project would remove the historical resource on the project site that is eligible for listing in the California Register under Criterion 3 as a significant example of the work of master architect Goodwin Steinberg.
- **Adoption of Findings Related To Mitigation Measures, including the following:** **Mitigation Measure CUL-1.1:** The City shall have Historic American Building Survey Level II documentation completed for the Mountain View Police Services - Fire Administration building and its setting. **Mitigation Measure CUL-1.2:** The City shall incorporate an exhibit or display of the Mountain View Police Services - Fire Administration building and a description of its historical significance into a publicly accessible portion of the proposed Public Safety Building.
- **Adoption of a Statement of Overriding Considerations (SOOC):** Council will consider approval of the project and finding that, to the extent that the identified significant adverse impact for the proposed project has not been reduced to acceptable levels through feasible mitigation or alternatives, there are specific economic, legal, social, technological, or other benefits that outweigh the project's significant unavoidable impact and support approval of the proposed project.
- **Adoption of a Mitigation Monitoring and Reporting Program (MMRP):** Council will consider a Mitigation Monitoring and Reporting Program (MMRP) that has been prepared for the proposed Mountain View Public Safety Building project (proposed project). The purpose of the MMRP is to ensure the implementation of mitigation measures identified as part of the environmental review for the proposed project.
